**IN THE MATTER OF THE HORSE RACING LICENCE ACT, 2015,
S.O. 2015, c.38, Sched. 9;
AND IN THE MATTER OF WAYNE H LAVIOLETTE**

Resulting from inspection numbers 3235963 and 3420252 at the stabling location of Wayne Laviolette on 26 June 2025 and 23 October 2025, respectively, the participant was found to have violated AGCO Standardbred rules 6.46.01 (b) & (d) by possessing improperly labelled and unlabelled medications which had not been labelled as being prescribed by an AGCO licenced veterinarian and/or labelled as for veterinary use according to *The Food and Drugs Act* (Canada) and AGCO Standardbred rule 3.09.01 (f) by failing to maintain records relating to the source of medications in his possession and the specifics of medication(s) administered to any horse(s) under his care and control and is hereby assessed a monetary penalty of one thousand dollars (\$1000) and is fully suspended for a period of thirty (30) days, starting 18 December 2025 until the expiry of his AGCO Standardbred licence on 21 December 2025, four (4) days, with the remaining twenty-six (26) days to be served upon issuance or renewal of his licence in accordance with the Horse Racing Licence Act (HRLA).

In accordance with AGCO Standardbred rule 10.06 all seized items are ordered destroyed per the Horse Racing Licence Act (HRLA).

6.46.01 No person shall possess, administer, traffic, or attempt to possess, administer, or traffic, in a drug, substance or medication, or anything held out to be a drug, substance or medication, for a horse:

(b) Which has not been labeled for veterinary use under the Food and Drugs Regulations under *The Food and Drugs Act* (Canada) or, if labeled for human use under the Food and Drugs Regulations, has not been prescribed by a veterinarian after conducting an examination of the horse and determining that the drug, substance or medication is medically required by the horse and the drug, substance or medication is used only for that horse in accordance with the prescription issued by the veterinarian; and/or

(d) Which is not labeled, or accurately labeled, with the contained drug, substance, medication, or active ingredient; and/or

SB 3.09.01 (f) A trainer shall maintain records relating to the particulars of any medications administered to horses in their care. For the purposes of this Rule, the term medication shall mean a medication that could result in a positive test.

10.06 After considering the evidence and making a Ruling concerning a violation of Rule 6.46.01 or Chapter 10, the Judges may order that the items seized be disposed of in accordance with the Horse Racing Licence Act, 2015.
